CV Maria Lassnig

Vita

1919

born on September 8 in Garzern near Kappel am Krappfeld in Carinthia, Austria

1925

moves to Klagenfurt with her family

1940—41

studies painting in the master class of Wilhelm Dachauer at the Academy of Fine Arts, Vienna

1943

leaves the class due to artistic differences with Dachauer and continues her studies under Ferdinand Andri and Herbert Boeckl in his evening nude painting classes

1945

Graduation from Academy of Fine Arts, Vienna. Return to Klagenfurt

1947

Lassnig meets Arnulf Rainer

1951

moves to Vienna. In the same year, thanks to a fellowship, Lassnig travels to Paris where she meets Paul Celan who arranged for her to meet representatives of Surrealism such as André Breton, Benjamin Péret and Toyen. Back in Austria, Lassnig and Rainer organize the “Unfigurative Malerei” (Non-figurative Painting) exhibition at the Künstlerhaus Klagenfurt

1954

returns to the Vienna Academy to attend the master school of painting under Albert Paris Gütersloh

1958

a study tour leads Lassnig to Italy and Greece (Rome, Naples, Athens, etc.)

1960

moves to Paris

1968

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moves to New York

1970

Lassnig attends an animated film class at the School of Visual Arts, New York. She created several (animated) films based on the template of body awareness drawings

1972

New York State Council Prize (for the animated film "Selfportrait")

1974

Lassnig was a co-founder of the Women/Artist/Filmmakers, Inc. in New York; this association included feminist filmmakers and artists such as Martha Edelheit, Carolee Schneemann, Silvianna Goldsmith as well as Rosalind Schneider.

1977

City of Vienna Prize for Fine Arts

1978

spends a year in Berlin (with a scholarship from the German Academic Exchange Service, DAAD)

1979

return to New York

1980

comes back to Vienna and is awarded a professorship – with a focus on painting – at the Hochschule für Angewandte Kunst (University of Applied Arts)

1980

exhibits with Valie Export at the Austrian pavilion of the Venice Biennale

1980—89

Lassnig heads the master class in painting at the Hochschule für angewandte Kunst in Vienna

1985

Carinthian Regional Prize

1988

Grand Austrian State Prize (for the first time conferred on a woman in the field of fine arts)

1982

participates in the Documenta in Kassel

1995

participates in the Venice Biennale, as well as in the 4th Istanbul Biennale

1998

Oskar Kokoschka Prize

2002

Roswitha Haftmann Prize

Rubens Prize of the City of Siegen (for the first time conferred on a woman artist)

Ring of Honour awarded by the Universität für angewandte Kunst (University of Applied Arts), Vienna

Max Beckmann Prize of the City of Frankfurt am Main

2005
